STATISHENT OF 1-

PASQUI Augusto, Dorna Rotta, Civitella, Arenzo. Male. Aged 47 years.

Who saith,

I have lived here all my life and am employed as a farmer.

On Thursday, 29th. June 1944, about 0600 hours, my brothers PASQUI Adelmo, aged 40 years and PASQUI Alfredo, aged 50 years, who were also farmers, left the house to go to church at CIVITELLA. That was the last time that I saw either of my brothers alive.

About 0730 hours I heard the sound of machinegun fire and could see houses burning in CIVITRIJA. When
I saw this I immediately went into a wood which is about one
kilometre west of my farm. I remained in this wood until
about 1200 hours. Then I made my way back home and when I
got there I found that my brothers had not returned from
CIVITRIJA. After the firing that I had heard I decided to
go and look for them.

when I was about 350 metres from CIVITELLA I saw three bedies lying on the road. I recognized one of these bodies as that of my brother PASQUI Adelmo. There were several bullet wounds in his head. The others were BOSCHI Ines, a woman, who had a bullet wound through the heart and D'ALESIO Attilio, a man, who had bullet wounds in the threat and stomach. I carried these bedies into a house and then carried on to CIVITELLA.

In consequence of what I was teld in the village I went into the house of CALDELLI and found a body which I recognised as that of my brother PASQUI Alfredo. I removed the body of my brother to a barber's shop where I prepared it for burial. He had a bullet wound in the head.

That evening I returned to my home where I made arrangements for coffins to be made.

On Saturday, 1st. July 1944, about 1030 hours, I returned to CIVITELLA and laid the bodies of my brothers at rest in the Municipal cemetery there.

Neither of my brothers were partisans and were never concerned in any partisan activity.

I know nothing of the persons who killed them.
