STATEMENT OF:-

Eugenia SENSINI, Female.
Farm Casa Vecchia, Aged 39 years.
Bucine.

Who saith,

I am the widow of Pietro SENSINI, aged 40 years, a farmer, and have lived in this locality for the past eleven years.

About 0845 hours on the 29th. June, 1944, my husband left the house to go to the farm of the MIGLIORINI family, a short distance away. He had previously made an arrangement with Giuseppe MIGLIORINI who had been ill for some time, to accompany him to the doctor at SAN PANORAZIO.

When my husband did not return home later that day I became worried. After making some enquiries I learned that some of the houses in SAN PANORAZIO had been set on fire by the Germans. Two days later I went to the village, but before I got there I was turned back by the German soldiers. I returned home and remained there until the Allied troops occupied the district.

Later in July, 1944, after hearing of the discovery of the dead bodies in the farm of PIERANIELLI, I went there to see if my husband was one of the victims. I saw some men removing the debris and amongst it I recognised parts of the clothing which my husband was wearing when he left home on the 29th. June, 1944.

My husband was not a partisan and did not do the Germans any harm when they were here.

This statement has been read over to me, it is correct and true. I herewith append my signature.
