STATEMENT OF:-

ARRIGUCCI Enrico, Male.
Albergo di Oliveto, Aged 31 years.
Civitella,
Arezzo.

Who saith,

I am a farm labourer and have lived here all my life.

Towards mid-June 44, a party of German soldiers, came here and occupied part of the villa of my governor Signor MAZZI, who at the time was evacuated from here.

These soldiers arrived with four or five trucks and I think they numbered about twenty. I do not remember much about these soldiers because I always endeavoured to keep away from them. In the locality of ALBERGO, where I live, they displayed a signboard which directed towards the village of OLIVETO. This sign consisted of the letter 'N' followed by the figure '5'.

As far as I can remember these soldiers departed from here on Sunday, 2nd. July 1944, and before leaving I believe they removed the sign-board.

This statement has been read over to me. It is true and correct. I herewith append my signature.
